Well, the school is back up and running after their "Summer" break for planting season. From reports we have heard, the students used their time well back in their home congregations preaching, teaching, and sharing the good news in their villages.

It didn't stop there either. Once they returned, they studied with one of the security guards at the school and baptized him. He introduced them to his wife and asked them to share the gospel with her as well, and it wasn't long before she gave her life to Christ and they baptized her.

All of that is part of an effort to start a new congregation on the school grounds. Every Sunday, students get a chance to lead, preach or teach during worship. The families of the staff have a welcoming congregation for them to worship in and the students have an easier job sharing the gospel to the people around the school as they don't have to walk several miles to get to another congregation now.

Our lead teacher, Wellos was asked to be part of an event held by Sunset School of Preaching in Kenya where they are helping satellite schools connect and be more effective in training. This will be the first trip for Wellos out of Malawi/Mozambique.

Both teachers are working hard on their Master's program and using their new knowledge to share with the students at MIBI and make the school even better as we will soon be able to be a full-fledged college, offering a Bachelor's degree from Malawi, not just one overseen in America.

Our other teacher, Phuka, is going back to school to get an education degree as well as finishing his Masters in Bible, as well as teaching daily at MIBI. Phew!

Please keep all of these families in your prayers as Malawi is beginning to experience a food shortage again after less than great harvest. Most Malawians make very little money and live off what they grow as they cannot afford to buy food. When the harvest is bad, it could mean some really hard times for them.
